

Dear Parents and Carers,

Safeguarding our children is key. One of the ways we do this is through the **Prevent Strategy**, **Prevent** is about safeguarding people and communities from the threat of terrorism. Radicalisation in children can happen over a period of time. In some cases, it is triggered by a specific incident or news item and can happen much quicker. Sometimes there are clear warning signs of radicalisation, in other cases the changes are less obvious. The following behaviours may indicate possible radicalisation:

- Refusing to listen to different points of view
- Unwilling to engage with children who are different
- Embracing conspiracy theories
- Feeling persecuted
- Changing friends and appearance
- Distancing themselves from old friends
- No longer doing things they used to enjoy
- Converting to a new religion
- Being secretive and reluctant to discuss their whereabouts
- Sympathetic to extremist ideologies

Online behaviours may change too, for example:

- Changing or having more than one online identity
- Accessing extremist online content
- Trying to join an extremist organisation

You know your child better than anyone, so trust your instincts if something feels wrong. You are in the best position to notice if they're acting out of character. Support is available at school to ensure that our children are not at risk of radicalisation.

School Direct Salaried Training

We offer a School Direct salaried route which culminates in QTS; we also offer a non-salaried School Direct PGCE route which culminates in QTS plus PGCE qualification, accredited by UEL.

The entry requirements for our salaried School direct course:

- GCSE grade C or above (or GCSE grade 5 or above for GCSEs sat in 2017 onwards) or equivalent in English Language, Mathematics and Science.
- A minimum of a lower second class (2:1) bachelor's degree from a UK University, or an overseas qualification of an equivalent standard.
- Professional skills test pass in Literacy and Numeracy before 1st July for a September start date to course.

For the salaried route you also need:

• Applicants must also display evidence of their commitment to and enjoyment of, working with children and young people (this may be through voluntary work with young people but must also include 10 days classroom experience within 1 year prior to course start date.

We may be able to offer a 10-day classroom placement within the Arbor Academy to support your application. Contact us for more details.

Places on the Primary School direct salaried route are in high demand so applicants should apply as soon as possible in the year before you wish to start training.
