

## Pupil Premium Statement 2016/2017

The Governors and Senior Leadership Team at the school believe that every child is an important member of our community and should be encouraged and challenged to achieve their full potential. The school budget is set by governors entirely on this basis – the key investment priority is always on initiatives that support all of our children to progress as governors, staff and parents would wish. The Pupil Premium Grant is just one part of the overall funding we invest to achieve this.

### School Overview

In the 2016 to 2017 financial year, all schools receive £1300 for each child registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.

### Barriers to learning

The barriers we recognise as impacting on our disadvantaged pupils' learning are:

- poor language and communication skills,
- lack of confidence,
- social and emotional difficulties
- poor attendance and punctuality issues
- complex family situations that prevent children from flourishing and parents from sometimes giving support with learning.

The challenges are varied and therefore we respond to the individual needs of our children.
