Context: In year 5 our topic is 'In the Beginning'. We would like you to research the importance of historic landmarks relevant to our topic -Prehistoric Britain (Stone Age). You would be required to create a Stonehenge silhouettes on sunrise backgrounds or a tea stained cave painting using a range of artistic techniques.

You may choose to consider the how you would create and engaging background: colouring pencils, felt tips paint, fabric and other materials. How would you create silhouettes? Think about the outline of Stonehenge and how it would compliment your designs.

Week 2: Think about how you would create a silhouettes and which colours you would choose. Start working on the background of your work .Be sure to allow enough time to get all your resources and create the background and the design.
